\*Students were evaluated on the following 1-7 rating scale: (1) Complete inability to demonstrate skill, (2) Demonstrates rudimentary level skills, but below that of the beginning level BSW student, (3) Demonstrates skill at the level of a beginning level BSW student, (4) Demonstrates skill at the level of the midpoint BSW level student, (5) Demonstrates skill at the level of a BSW graduate, (6) Demonstrates skill at the level expected of a BSW graduate with less than 2 years of social work experience, (7) Demonstrates skill-level of a highly experienced and seasoned BSW practitioner. *Proficiency* is at 5 or higher.
